- Made positive contributions to develop coaching in the community.
- Overcame particular challenges (hard to reach areas, lack of facilities).
- Contributed to the development of the sport at grass roots level.

Event Official

- Demonstrated commitment to British Cycling events either as an Official or as a Race Organiser.
- Made a positive contribution to events in their region.
